Graduate Degree in Psychoanalysis

The degree program in psychoanalysis includes instruction:

Individual analysis

Supervised clinical practice

Presentations and seminars

Group dynamics and case study

Although C.G. Jung was not Christian, in fact he believed religion to be myth, course work will examine Jungian psychotherapy including clinical, interpersonal, and archetypal approaches, and a broad understanding of the human condition. The program may be completed at the students own pace and may include a blend of residential and distance learning courses. Students should consult their advisor for specific course information.
