Bachelor of Business Administration

Requirements: You need a High School Diploma or equivalent documentation in order to enter the undergraduate program.

For the Bachelor of Business Administration you are required: 125 Semester Hours in order to graduate. This includes 33 credit hours of study fitting to the prevalent education requirements, the prescribed number of units, in the fields of the following courses:

English (6 units); Written & Oral Communications (3 units); Natural Science (6 units); Mathematics (6 units); Social Science (6 units); Humanities (6 units).

Therefore, the student must be certain to finish an attainable amount of 33 semester hours while enrolled at St. Albert's College & Graduate School.

Master of Business Administration

Requirements: You need a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration or allied field from an accredited college/or university.

Even if you have completed an undergraduate degree in another field it will be comparable to a Bachelor's Degree, thus it will be accepted. But, you may have to take several other courses at the graduate level to introduce you into Business Administration.

The fulfilled requirements for the Master's In Business Administration Degree are (35) credit hours above the Bachelor's degree.

Doctor of Business Administration in Marketing

Requirements: The (DBA) is created for professionals who are interested in further developing their careers by matriculating in this advanced terminal degree in business administration. This degree is mainly for practitioners-executives and managers (administrators) in business, government, and consultants.

The doctoral candidate must have a Master's of Business Administration in order to be accepted into the DBA degree program.

The doctoral candidate must complete 60 semester units. Forty-five (45) hours entail the completion of fifteen (15) classes; the remaining 15 units are the candidate's doctoral dissertation. After the completion of the 15 classes, the candidate is eligible to take the Comprehensive Examination. All students are required to take and pass a written comprehensive examination.
